
HOLY (MAUNDY) THURSDAY "A New Covenant for You" April 17, 2025

AS WE GATHER

Maundy Thursday is when the Christian Church honors the memory of Jesus establishing what we call the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. Jesus gathered with His Disciples to honor the memory of the Passion Event, the 10th and final Plague God sent against Pharoah and the Egyptians: the Death of the First Born. To protect the People of God, God instructed them to sacrifice a lamb for each family, take it's blood and place it on the top and sides of their door, and then to feast on the lamb with unleavened bread. When God brought the Judgement upon Egypt, "the Blood of the Sacrificed Lamb of God" Redeemed the People of God from the Judgement against All Sin. The Bread and the Wine of the Sacrament are the Body and Blood of Jesus in our Sacramental Eating and Drinking, which assures us intimately of God's Forgiveness.

+ STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR +

Pastor: After the Last Supper, less than twenty-four hours remained in the Earthly Life of our Lord. Events moved rapidly: prayer in Gethsemane; betrayal by Judas; arrest, mock trial, painful beating; the trudge to Golgotha and execution by crucifixion.

Jesus' offered Body and His shed Blood have been given to us in, with, and under the bread and wine in the Sacred Mystery that is the Sacrament. As He was removed from us in the grave, so we remove the elements and vessels of this Sacrament.

The Cross is where Jesus took on our punishment to be able to give us the Gift of Heaven. When John the Baptizer saw Jesus, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, Who takes away the Sin of the World!" (John 1:29). As this statement was fulfilled on the Cross, (the cross is removed from the Altar area.) The Altar Cross is draped in Black.

The missal stand holds our worship books that guide our worship life together as we sing praises to God. As Jesus suffers, our songs of joy are removed from our lips.

As Creation was dark while Jesus suffered, so we extinguish our candles and remove them.

The coverings and paraments are made of fine linen and brocade, materials appropriate for feasting with our King. As our King's body was stripped in crucifixion, so our Altar is stripped of its coverings.

The Via Dolorosa (The way of Sorrow), Solo sung by Katie DeVries, accompanied by Donna Munnik on piano.
