CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Pastor: We have not deserved the good things we have received.

All: In His Grace, God has blessed us out of His Love and Mercy.

Pastor: Ever since the time of the Israelites living in Canaan, God's people have been charged with the responsibility to influence their culture, rather than to be influenced by it. Let us examine our hearts in the Light of God's Law, the Ten Commandments, and confess our sins before Him.

All: You shall have no other gods. You shall not misuse the Name of the Lord your God. Remember the Sabbath Day by keeping it Holy. Honor your father and your mother. You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not lie. You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse, position or possessions, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.

(A time of silence for private reflection/confession)

Pastor: We confess:

All: Most Merciful God, our land is filled with selfishness, violence, hatred, lack of love and compassion. We are surrounded by evil in our culture; and we have often imitated the evil in our culture. We have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. But You are Merciful and we ask Your Forgiveness, for Jesus' sake.

Pastor: "If You, O Lord, kept a record of sins, O Lord, who could stand? But with You there is Forgiveness." [*Psalm 130:3*]

It is through God's Love and Christ's Perfect Sacrifice for our sins, that I, an Ordained servant of Christ, announce to you the full and free forgiveness of all your sins – in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen

+ SERVICE OF THE SACRAMENT +

Pastor: We bless You, Lord of Heaven and Earth. Even while Your Creation fought against You, You gave Your Only Begotten Son into Death that we might be saved. You have given us this Holy Supper, "For as often as we eat of this Bread and drink of this Cup, we proclaim the Lord's Death until He Comes."

All: Christ has Died, Christ is Risen, Christ will Come again.

Pastor: By Your Holy Spirit, prepare our hearts to receive the true Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ with living faith.

All: Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

THE WORDS OF OUR LORD

Pastor: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took Bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the Disciples and said: "*Take, eat; this is My Body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me.*"

In the same way also He took the Cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "*Drink of it, all of you; this Cup is the New Testament in My Blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.*"



DISTRIBUTION:

All who Commune receive the true Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

Therefore, each one must take seriously the responsibility to examine oneself:

- To acknowledge oneself as a sinner and repent of one's sins.
 - To trust Jesus as one's Savior for forgiveness and submit to Him as Lord.
 - To believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Sacrament, that His true Body and Blood are received in, with, and under the elements of bread and wine.
 - To ask the Holy Spirit to assist in living a moral and obedient life to glorify God.
- St. John, Cudahy is a member of the SELC District of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod (LCMS). Communing here implies agreement with the teachings and practices of the LCMS. Questions? Please speak with Pastor.
